

NLS Seminar with Anne Lysy (AMS)



As part of our *red thread* series, and as previously announced, the London Society presents a talk on the theme of the next Congress, *About the Unconscious, Place and Interpretation of Formations of the Unconscious in Psychoanalytic Treatments*, by former President of the NLS, Anne Lysy (AMS). Her title, as indicated in the poster above, picks out a quotation from Lacan's 23rd Seminar, *The Sinthome*, which defines the drives as "an echo in the body" of a fact of saying, and in exploring this new formulation of the drive, her talk will consider the way that Lacan's late teaching transforms, not only our conception of the unconscious, but also the question of what is at stake in the very practice of interpretation as we deploy it in the clinic today.
